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Welcome to Online PG Admission 2021-'22

Selection and Admission Procedure

Due to Covid-19 Pandemic, the Common Entrance Test (CET) will not be conducted by Bajkul Milani Mahavidyalaya affiliated to Vidyasagar University (V.U.) for the admission to PG & other programmes for the academic session 2021-22.

1. Preparation of Merit List for the students of Vidyasagar University [80% of total seats]

1.1 The admission of the 80% category students, the merit list will be prepared in the following manner:

- a) UG (Hons) final percentage of marks (Part-I, Part-II & Part-III taking together) in case of annual system. OR
- b) UG (Hons) equivalent percentage of marks converted from CGPA, in case of semester (CBCS) system.

1.2 In case of a tie, marks obtained in the immediately preceding Examination are to be considered for ranking.

1.3 Eligibility Criteria for 80% of seats [Vidyasagar University and its autonomous colleges]: Honours in relevant subjects

Reservation for 80% of seats

1.4 Reservation of 80% of seats [Vidyasagar University and its autonomous colleges]:

1.4.1 Reservation policy will be considered as per Govt. order 906 Edn / Estt dated 18.09.1997. The category wise percentage (%) of reserved seat is as follows: SC-22%, ST-6%, OBC-A-10%, OBC-B-7%. Fraction of 0.5% or more will be rounded to the next whole number.

1.4.2 5% of each category will be reserved for differently-abled candidates. Merit list will be prepared on the percentage of disability. In case of non-availability of **differently-abled candidate**, the seat reserved for differently-abled candidates of the particular category will be **converted to that Category only**.

1.4.3 Sports & Cultural Quota: 1% of total seats of all PG courses is reserved as Sports/ Culture quota.

1.4.4 Prize holders at International/National/State representation in the last two years will be considered for Sports Quota provided that he/she has participated in the Inter College Competition/ Inter College Athletic Meet organized by our university in his/her tenure in UG level. The sports events are Football, Volleyball, Athletic, Yoga, Khokho, Kabadi, Chess and Table Tennis. A committee will be constituted to assess the performance of the applicants in the respective field.

1.4.5 Prize holders Prize holders in the International/National/State meets in the last two years will be considered for Cultural Quota provided that he/she has participated in the Inter College Cultural Competition organized by our university in his/her tenure in UG level. A committee will be constituted to assess the performance of the applicants in the respective field.

1.4.4 Prize holders The seats in the particular subjects will be reduced by the number of candidates selected for Sports/Culture Quota in that subject. The seat will be reduced from the particular category (Gen/Sc/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B) in which he/she belongs.

2. Preparation of Merit List for Open (Vidyasagar University and autonomous colleges affiliated to Vidyasagar University & Other Universities) to all categories [20% of total seats]:

2.1 The admission of the 20% category students (open to all, including students of Vidyasagar University & autonomous college(s) affiliated to Vidyasagar University), the merit list will be prepared in the following manner.

a) UG (Hons) percentage of marks obtained (Part-I, Part-II and Part-III taking together) for the annual system. OR

b) UG (Hons) equivalent percentage of marks converted from CGPA as per the rule fixed by their home institution, in case of semester (CBCS) system.

c) If the result of Final Semester is to be awaited, UG (Hons) equivalent percentage of marks would be converted from CGPA as per the rule fixed by their home institution, based on the first five semesters (Sem-I to Sem-V) in case of semester (CBCS) system.

2.2 In case of a tie, marks obtained in the immediately preceding Examination are to be considered for ranking.

2.3 Eligibility Criteria for 20% of seats: the minimum marks required for admission through Open Competition (20% of total seats) is as follows:

a) 45% marks in Hons. (for General Candidates) for both Arts and Science

b) 40% marks in Hons. (for SC/ ST/ differently-abled/ OBC-A/ OBC-B Candidates) for both Arts and Science

Reservation for 20% of seats

2.4 Reservation of 20% of seats [Vidyasagar University & autonomous college(s) affiliated to Vidyasagar University and other universities]:

2.4.1 Reservation policy will be considered as per Govt. order 906 Edn / Estt dated 18.09.1997. The category wise percentage (%) of reserved seat is as follows: SC-22%, ST-6%, OBC-A-10%, OBC-B-7%. Fraction of 0.5% or more will be rounded to the next whole number.

2.4.2 5% of each category will be reserved for differently-abled candidates. Merit list will be prepared on the percentage of disability. In case of non-availability of differently abled candidate, the seat reserved for differently-abled candidates of the particular category will be converted to that Category only.

Eligibility percentage of marks for 20% of seats:

The minimum marks required for admission through Open Competition (20% of total seats) is as follows:

| a) | Arts: All Subjects: Bengali, Sanskrit, Philosophy and History 45% marks in Hons. (for Gen. Candidates) 40% marks in Hons. (for SC / ST/ differently-abled /OBC-A/OBC-B Candidates) |
| b) | Science: All Subjects: Geography 45% marks in Hons. (for Gen. Candidates) 40% marks in Hons. (for SC / ST/ differently-abled /OBC-A/OBC-B Candidates) |
| 6. | Online provisional admission will be done based on the merit list thus published through the college admission portal. |
| 7. | The verification of testimonials & other documents for provisionally admitted students will be initiated after commencement of classes. |
| 8. | The verification will be held in the concerned department by the appropriate body. |
| 9. | The admission will be cancelled if a student remains absent from classes for consecutive ten days from the date of commencement of classes without any intimation to the concerned Head of the Departments, and the admission fees paid will not be refunded. |
| 10. | If any candidate shifts to another institution without intimation to the university within ten days from the date of commencement of classes, the admission fees paid will not be refunded. |
| 11. | If a student applies to the college authority for cancellation of admission within ten days from the date of commencement of classes, the refundability of the admission fees would be considered as per UGC/ State Govt. norms or order. |

Instructions for calculation of UG % of Marks:

1. Candidates of 80% category:

| (b) | In case of semester (CBCS) system, UG (Hons) equivalent percentage of marks converted from CGPA based on the all semesters (Sem-I to Sem-VI), as per the rule fixed by Vidyasagar University. |

2. Candidates of 20% category:

| (b) | In case of semester (CBCS) system, UG (Hons) equivalent percentage of marks converted from CGPA as per the rule fixed by their home institution, based on the all semesters (Sem-I to Sem-VI). |
| (c) | <i>If the result of Final Semester is to be awaited, UG (Hons) equivalent percentage of marks would be converted from CGPA as per the rule fixed by their home institution, based on the first five semesters (Sem-I to Sem-V) in case of semester (CBCS) system.</i> |

Example of percentage (%) of marks calculation for Semester system (CBCS):

a) For the Vidyasagar University semester system (CBCS) the calculation of equivalent percentage of marks upto 6th semester is as follows:

Percentage calculation upto 6th Semester:

$$\text{CGPA} = \frac{(20 \times 1\text{st Sem.SGPA}) + (22 \times 2\text{nd Sem.SGPA}) + (26 \times 3\text{rd Sem.SGPA}) + (26 \times 4\text{th Sem.SGPA}) + (24 \times 5\text{th Sem.SGPA}) + (24 \times 6\text{th Sem.SGPA})}{118}$$

Let, CGPA from the above calculation = 7.1

The equivalent percentage of marks for V.U. students (as per conversion rule of V.U)
= $7.1 \times 10 = 71$

b) For other institutions with semester system (CBCS) having different conversion rules:

Similarly, for the students of other University/ Institution and Autonomous Colleges affiliated to V.U, percentage of marks will be calculated as per the percentage conversion rule fixed by their home University/ Institution and Colleges.
